

# Verb Sort

## Regular or Irregular?

**Regular verbs** are verbs whose past tense or past participles are formed by adding d or ed to the end of the verb. *Examples* are: jump/jumped, play/played.

**Irregular verbs** don't conform to the above rule. *Examples* are: ran/run, fall/fell/fallen, eat/ate/eaten, say/said. (*You would never say runned or eated.*)
