- 11. What is meant by 'malicious advertising'. Provide an example.
- 12. What is malware and spyware? How is it avoided?
- 13. List 3 tips for safe and secure online shopping.
- 14. Make a list of 10 tips for information sharing.
- 15. Describe a time when a media message impacted you (or someone you know) in a negative way.
- 16. Would you consider yourself savvy with digital literacy? Why or why not?
- 17. If anything is possible, how could you use media to make a positive difference?
- 18. What are the pros and cons of video gaming?
- 19. What is advergaming? Does it bother you? Why or why not? Is it effective? Why or why not?
